



Headteacher Message



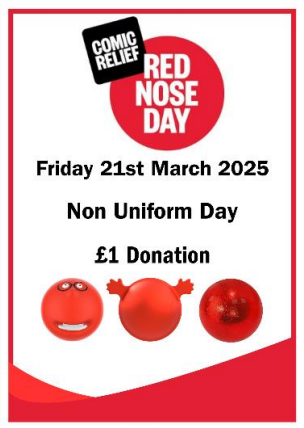

On Wednesday in Science we completed our model homes for Max from 'Where the Wild Things are'. The children had to design their houses so they would withstand the strong winds on the island; have a waterproof roof to stop Max getting wet and create windows for him to see out of and some

On Thursday the children created hand puppets and used a template to cut out their own felt!
