We talked about three different approaches to reconciliation- saying sorry, making things right and making things better. To illustrate this, we talked about the story of Zaccheus and how he was changed by meeting Jesus. We have challenged the children to live out our school vision by recognising when things do go wrong and seeking reconciliation.
