Welcome back to January 2026! A new year is always exciting, and we look forward to fresh opportunities, progress, and exciting events ahead. Hopefully, this will be a calmer term (without the snow and ice making things a bit tricky!) with a real focus on the excellent work taking place in our classrooms. Once again, thank you to everyone that was so generous and kind with their Christmas gifts and cards.



On Monday, each class will send home their learning journeys, explaining to parents what pupils will be focusing on this term. As always, if you have any questions about your child's learning or life in school, please do come and speak to their teacher.

This term in Collective Worship, our focus is: The Life of Jesus. We will be exploring passages across the four gospels – Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. I hope that by exploring these stories through worship, everyone will have a better understanding of the Gospel message that Jesus brought when he came to earth as God in human form (Incarnation) and how we can lead our lives positively in school and out with a focus on Love, Respect and Responsibility.

This term, we will continue our work on implementing our new behaviour policy across the school. Miss Johnson will have a meeting with you all in the coming weeks to share further details.

Another focus this term is on behaviour for learning and our school environment. Behaviour for learning includes developing emotional, social, and cognitive skills that enable children to learn effectively in the classroom setting and prepare them for life beyond school. When looking at the school environment, we will continue to work on developing key areas – during the next couple of term will be developing the Library and SEND area. We will also be focusing on the general tidiness and organisation of the school. When we have a clear and organised spaces to learn in – one that is cared for and respected – we create the conditions for everyone to excel even more. Please do explore these ideas further at home, and consider giving your children responsibilities around the house.

This helps them develop independence, respect for their environment, and a sense of ownership – all of which support their learning and personal development.

Parent and child surveys will be taking place this term, so please keep an eye out. We truly value your feedback and use it to continue improving our school.
