Parents to respond yes or no

Staff in school to choose from 'yes' list. This will be based on those that have not had an opportunity previously or by randomly selecting names.

(Logs are kept in school for this)

Email from school to say your child has been selected with further event information. By consenting on SchoolGateway you are stating that you are happy that your child's name can be shared with others selected to support with travelling to the event (unless you tell us otherwise). By consenting, you are also happy for photos to be taken by the school, event organisers and parents

attending (unless you tell us otherwise). Ernail from school to say on this occasion your child has not been selected (after we have heard back from the majority).

(There may be the occasion where someone drops out or cannot make it - we will then contact individual parents)

COMPETATIVE EVENT/COMPETITION

Staff in school to pick a team based on ability seen within school. Email to parents with details and to say they have been selected.

On some occasions we may ask parents for this if it is not a sport we have done in school before.

Email from school to say your child has been selected with further event information. By consenting on SchoolGateway you are stating that you are happy that your child's name can be shared with others selected to support with travel to the event (unless you tell us otherwise). By consenting, you are also happy for photos to be taken by the school, event organisers and parents attending (unless you tell us otherwise).
