In Elms Class, the children have been delving deep into their scientific learning by exploring plants that can be eaten. The children enjoyed trying some raw vegetables with some hummus and coriander dip!



Yesterday, children from our Eco club took centre stage to talk to the whole school about their important work. The children were invited by Miss Johnson to talk about the laminated notes that have magically appeared around the school near light switches, laptops and smartboards.

The children explained that Eco club had audited the school to investigate how many lights and devices were left on unnecessarily. The children discovered that as many as 27 lights were on when they need not be and that many computers and smartboards were on standby. They were so shocked by these results that they decided to take action!



Eco club informed the children that the majority of electricity is produced by non-renewable energy sources such as burning fossil fuels and that although we have the right to learn, it should not be at the expense of our other rights. This is why the children had wanted to make notes to remind children and adults to switch off lights and devices when they are unused.

In Willows class the children have been investigating which plants and animals that they might find in the rainforest. The children then showed their knowledge using a range of mediums and gave careful consideration to the different textures and layers of the rainforest by using a range of materials.



This week, year 5 and 6 were invited to attend a workshop / performance about Internet Safety at the STAG theatre. The children learnt about the importance of staying safe online, safe gaming, protection from online grooming, protecting their privacy and why it is important not to talk to strangers online.



In year 3, the children have been considering their right to an identity. They looked at how avatars are used for apps and games and then looked closely to think about how others like, hobbies or personalities might be reflected in their avatar designs. The children then created their own, thinking about what these designs might tell people.

The children thought about how useful avatars might be for discussing things when you might not want to be identified and also considered that people can use avatars to mask themselves online.
