

Visit from Author Gianna Pollero

We worked together in randomly selected pairs to encourage our collaborative skills. Mr Howse told us that there were 11 unique nets so we had to be careful to not repeat by using rotations or inversions. Here is Isabelle's evidence of the nets she



found – she then checked off what she had found against the possible nets below. Well done!

The following lesson, we were challenged to work as a class to create the 11 unique nets from scratch using card and masking tape. We had to elect two leaders (we chose Archie and Nathan) who then guided us through the task. We had to use a lot of collaboration to succeed, but as you can see, we managed to do it together!
