

Headteacher Message

This week, our whole staff team came together for further training on our new behaviour policy led by Miss Johnson. It was a wonderful opportunity for everyone to develop their skills together and ensure we're all working consistently to support your children. The session was really positive, and I'm confident this will continue to strengthen the supportive and respectful environment we're building at Ide Hill.

All families should now have received their child's learning journey for this term. These documents outline what your children will be learning across different subjects, and I'd encourage you to read through them carefully. Please do ask your children lots of questions about what they're learning - your interest and engagement makes such a difference to their enthusiasm and progress. If you have any questions about what your child/ren will be doing, or if they bring home homework that you don't understand, please don't hesitate to come in and ask. We're here to support you in supporting them.

I'm delighted to share that Year 6 have been working with once again with Sevenoaks School this term on creative writing. It's brilliant to have them back in school, and they're really challenging our children to develop their writing skills further. The children are hopefully enjoying these sessions.

We've sent out our pupil survey this week, and children will be completing it over the coming weeks. This is such an important way for us to hear directly from your children about their experiences at school, and I'm looking forward to reading their responses.

In collective worship this week, we've been exploring two important themes. We've discussed how gifts don't always have to be physical things. Other ways we can give to others include our time and attention, acts of kindness and service, words of encouragement, forgiveness, patience and understanding.

We've also been thinking about how sometimes we have to wait for good things to happen, or persevere with something even when it's difficult. We reflected on different bible stories showing how others waited many years for God's promise of a child to be fulfilled. It reminds us that patience and faith can lead to wonderful outcomes, even when the wait feels long!

Next week, some of our children will be representing the school at a debating event at Sevenoaks School. This is a fantastic opportunity for them to develop their confidence and critical thinking skills. I'm really looking forward to seeing how it goes.

This week, I've been out on learning walks around the school, alongside other subject leads who have also been looking in books. I'm pleased to share some of the positive things we've seen: excellent behaviour for learning with children focused and engaged, thoughtful adaptations to support all children in accessing their

learning, polite and respectful interactions throughout the school, improved tidiness across the school environment, and children talking confidently about what they're learning. It's wonderful to see our school community thriving in so many ways.

Thank you for your continued support. Together, we're helping every child at Ide Hill to flourish.
