

Bell Ringing!

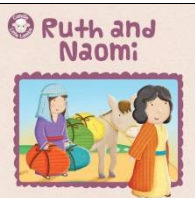
Year 6 had fun this afternoon at St Mary's church, Sundridge and Brasted, learning about the role of a campanologist.
